- Education experience, with some background in natural resources
- Strong communication skills, including excellent English, both spoken and written
- Ability to work independently
- Interest in working with colleagues from diverse backgrounds

Work with *Global Connections: Forests of the World*

Project Learning Tree and the World Forestry Center created *Global Connections: Forests of the World*, a guide and activity set for educators to help students gain an increased understanding and appreciation of world forest environments, with an emphasis on the human interaction with, and dependence on, those environments. The module activities provide students with opportunities to apply scientific processes and higher order thinking skills while investigating world forestry issues and conducting service learning action projects. The special project for this Fellowship involves continuing research and curriculum development for *Global Connections: Forests of the World*. Duties would include:

- Research and curriculum development, including assembling bibliographical materials, collecting workshop agendas and surveying training models.
- Identify and assemble resources for state program implementation, including maps, pictures, resources, speakers, etc.
- Create and maintain a database of environmental education contacts from around the world.
- Create presentations, articles, and case studies related to *Forests of the World* curriculum.
- Review activity modules for revision and updates.
- Create and assemble forest education kits.

In addition to the special project, the Fellowship also involves:

- The opportunity to develop the contacts and skills to advance your professional career.
- Visits and field tours to public and private forestry organizations each week, including forests, harvest sites, management and research agencies, manufacturing and processing facilities.
- Working with forestry colleagues from around the world.

Other information:

- Fellow will be provided with a stipend of \$1,000 USD per month after taxes for living expenses. Health insurance, a public transportation pass, assistance locating housing, and personal orientation to Portland are also provided.
- Fellow is responsible for sharing cost of obtaining a visa (\$1200 USD) and return airfare.
